

Standing, Sitting, Kneeling

According to the custom of England and Wales

At High or Low Mass, the triple bell at the celebrant's *Domine, non sum dignus* is the signal for the faithful to approach the altar rails for Holy Communion. Anyone standing in the aisles should kneel for the *Ecce Agnus Dei*.

Low Mass

As the priest enters, the congregation should kneel.

From beginning to Gospel	kneel
At the Gospel	stand
At the Credo	stand
During the Offertory	sit
From the Sanctus to the Last Gospel	kneel
At the Last Gospel	stand
Post-Missal prayers and exit of priest	kneel

High Mass and Missa Cantata

During the processional entry	stand
During the <i>Asperges</i>	stand
From beginning to <i>Gloria</i>	kneel
At the intoning of the <i>Gloria</i>	stand
<i>If the congregation sings, remain standing. If the choir only, sit when the clergy do. Rise with the celebrant for:</i>	
<i>Dominus Vobiscum</i> and Collects	stand
At the singing of the Epistle	sit
At the singing of the Gospel	stand
At the notices and for the Sermon	sit
At the Credo	stand
<i>As at the Gloria. Rise with the celebrant for:</i>	
<i>Dominus Vobiscum, Oremus</i>	stand
During the Offertory	sit
<i>Rise when the congregation is incensed</i>	
Preface dialogue to <i>Sanctus</i>	stand
<i>Sanctus</i> , Canon, Communion	kneel
<i>Dominus Vobiscum</i> and Post Communion	stand
At the Blessing	kneel
Last Gospel to exit of clergy	stand
